

65 One big problem is the mismatch between general knowledge and special knowledge. Generally 66 speaking, explicating the needed service and/or products can be done with different level of details.



79 The problem with special knowledge is, that in some cases it can take years of serious efforts for 80 actually mastering some knowledge area.



152 One aspect is, that there is a complex web of agreement, ownership and membership in all 153 procurement situations. In some cases there can be serious problems with agreement, ownership and 154 membership.


